SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes] **Authorizes City of Hillsboro to establish** pilot program of Cyber Awareness, Responsibility and Ethics to help students become safe and responsible citizens of cyber community. *[Allows Department of Education to accept contributions of funds from certain sources. Allows school districts to apply for grants from Department of Education to pay for participation in pilot program.]*
Sunsets *[June 30, 2007]* **January 2, 2008.**
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2005.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to pilot program of Cyber Awareness, Responsibility and Ethics; and declaring an emer-
3 gency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. (1) The City of Hillsboro may establish for the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school**
6 **years the pilot program of Cyber Awareness, Responsibility and Ethics (CARE).**

7 **(2) If the City of Hillsboro establishes the pilot program:**

8 **(a) The goal of the pilot program is to help students who are 8 to 10 years of age become**
9 **safe and responsible citizens of the cyber community. To meet this goal, the City of Hillsboro**
10 **through the pilot program shall encourage:**

11 **(A) Partnerships between school districts and local law enforcement agencies to have**
12 **members of local law enforcement agencies act as mentors and provide focus, oversight and**
13 **guidance in the classroom; and**

14 **(B) Peer teaching among students.**

15 **(b) A school district may notify the City of Hillsboro that the school district would like**
16 **to participate in the pilot program. A notice provided by a school district under this sub-**
17 **section must include the following information:**

18 **(A) How the school district will implement the pilot program;**

19 **(B) How the activities of the school district under the pilot program will help the school**
20 **district implement the Children's Internet Protection Act (P.L. 106-554);**

21 **(C) How the school district will encourage students to participate in the pilot program;**
22 **and**

23 **(D) Which local law enforcement agencies will form partnerships with the school district.**

24 **(e) After receiving notice from a school district under paragraph (b) of this subsection,**
25 **the City of Hillsboro may provide information to the school district about instructional ma-**

1 **terials that may be used in conjunction with the pilot program.**

2 **(d) At the end of the 2005-2006 school year, each school district participating in the pilot**
3 **program shall report to the City of Hillsboro on the progress of the pilot program. The report**
4 **shall include:**

5 **(A) The number of students participating in the pilot program;**

6 **(B) The local law enforcement agencies that formed a partnership with the school dis-**
7 **trict; and**

8 **(C) An assessment of student attitudes toward the cyber community.**

9 **(e) Prior to February 1, 2007, the City of Hillsboro shall report to the Seventy-fourth**
10 **Legislative Assembly on the results of the pilot program.**

11 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2005 Act is repealed on January 2, 2008.**

12 **SECTION 3. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect**
14 **July 1, 2005.**
