SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Appropriates moneys from General Fund to _____ for biennial expenses.]
Limits **certain** biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts **and federal funds**, but excluding lottery funds *[and federal funds]*, collected or received by *[_____]* **Department of Consumer and Business Services**.
[Limits biennial expenditures by _____ from federal funds.]
Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.
Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2005.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
5 **\$177,450,440 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**
6 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**
7 **and including federal funds, but excluding lottery funds, collected or received by the De-**
8 **partment of Consumer and Business Services, for occupational safety and health-related ac-**
9 **tivities, manufactured home inspections and senior health insurance benefit programs.**

10 **SECTION 2. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, the following expenditures by the**
11 **Department of Consumer and Business Services are not limited:**

12 (1) Expenditures from the Workers' Benefit Fund;

13 (2) Expenditures from the Self-Insured Employer Adjustment Reserve;

14 (3) Expenditures from the Self-Insured Employer Group Adjustment Reserve;

15 (4) Expenditures from the Oregon Medical Insurance Pool Account for payment of claims
16 and third party administration contracts;

17 (5) Expenditures from the Consumer and Business Services Fund for payment of con-
18 tracted collection costs, including contracted processing costs for the Combined Payroll Tax
19 Reporting Program, contracted building codes permit issuance costs and workers' compen-
20 sation paying agent reimbursements as outlined in ORS 656.307;

21 (6) Expenditures from the Funeral and Cemetery Consumer Protection Trust Fund; and

22 (7) Special payments to the Oregon Health and Science University for research on occu-
23 pational illness and disease.

24 **SECTION 3. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
25 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect**
