**SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

**Adjusts appropriations and expenditure limitations of certain agencies for biennium ending June 30, 2005.**

Declares emergency, effective *[July 1, 2005]* on passage.

**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

2 Relating to state financial administration; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring  
3 an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**  
6 **made to the Department of Education by section 1 (1), chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2003, for**  
7 **the biennium ending June 30, 2005, as modified by Emergency Board action, is decreased by**  
8 **\$1,101,000, and the General Fund appropriation made to the department for the State School**  
9 **Fund by section 31, chapter 710, Oregon Laws 2003, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004,**  
10 **as modified by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$1,101,000.**

11 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation**  
12 **made to the Public Defense Services Commission by section 1 (3), chapter 635, Oregon Laws**  
13 **2003, for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, as modified by Emergency Board action, is de-**  
14 **creased by \$198,000, and the General Fund appropriation made to the commission by section**  
15 **1 (1), chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2003, for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, as modified by**  
16 **Emergency Board action, is increased by \$198,000.**

17 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the State Board of**  
18 **Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the payment of expenses of the**  
19 **board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding**  
20 **lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on**  
21 **expenditures for the board established by section 9, chapter 504, Oregon Laws 2003, as mod-**  
22 **ified by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$7,100.**

23 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Oregon Liquor**  
24 **Control Commission for the payment of expenses of the commission from fees, moneys or**  
25 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**

1 funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on expenditures for the com-  
2 mission established by section 1 (2), chapter 718, Oregon Laws 2003, as modified by Emer-  
3 gency Board action, is increased by \$222,000.

4 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Oregon Military  
5 Department for the payment of expenses of the department from federal funds collected or  
6 received by the department for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on expen-  
7 ditures for the department established by section 3, chapter 620, Oregon Laws 2003, as mod-  
8 ified by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$2,100,000.

9 **SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Department of  
10 State Police for the payment of expenses of the department from fees, moneys or other re-  
11 venues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, for the biennium end-  
12 ing June 30, 2005, the limitation on expenditures for the department established by section  
13 2 (3), chapter 666, Oregon Laws 2003, as modified by Emergency Board action, is increased  
14 by \$482,887.

15 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Housing and  
16 Community Services Department for the payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated  
17 from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the department for lottery  
18 bonds for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on expenditures for the depart-  
19 ment established by section 3, chapter 679, Oregon Laws 2003, as modified by section 23,  
20 chapter 732, Oregon Laws 2003, and by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$30,000.

21 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Housing and  
22 Community Services Department for the payment of expenses of the department from fed-  
23 eral funds collected or received by the department, other than those described in section 2,  
24 chapter 679, Oregon Laws 2003, for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on  
25 expenditures for the department established by section 4, chapter 679, Oregon Laws 2003, as  
26 modified by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$6,500,000.

27 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Department of  
28 Transportation for the payment of expenses of the department from fees, moneys or other  
29 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimbursement  
30 from the United States Department of Transportation, collected or received by the Depart-  
31 ment of Transportation for the biennium ending June 30, 2005, the limitation on expenditures  
32 for the Department of Transportation established by section 81 (3), chapter 710, Oregon Laws  
33 2003, as modified by Emergency Board action, is increased by \$35,000,000.

34 **SECTION 10.** This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
35 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect  
36 on its passage.
