2 Whereas Ronald S. Coine was born on August 4, 1948, and passed away on February 24, 2004;
3 and

4 Whereas Ronald S. Coine served as a member of the Army National Guard from 1968 to 1974;
5 and

6 Whereas Ronald S. Coine served as a Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputy from 1972 until he
7 was shot in the arm while investigating a burglary call in 1973; and

8 Whereas Ronald S. Coine earned his teaching degree from the University of South Dakota in
9 1974, and established a youth center on that campus while he was a student there; and

10 Whereas Ronald S. Coine earned a degree in special education from California State University
11 in 1977; and

12 Whereas Ronald S. Coine began his career with the Portland Public School District in 1977,
13 where he taught special education at Cleveland High School in southeast Portland for 23 years, re-
14 tiring in 1999; and

15 Whereas Ronald S. Coine began volunteer service as a Reserve Deputy Sheriff for the
16 Multnomah County Sheriff's Office in 1977, where he served for 11 years; and

17 Whereas Ronald S. Coine transferred to the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office as a Reserve
18 Deputy Sheriff in 1988, where he achieved the rank of Lieutenant; and

19 Whereas Ronald S. Coine was the devoted husband of Claire, his wife of 29 years, father to sons
20 Jerad and Brandon, and grandfather to Cameryn and Caleb; and

21 Whereas Ronald S. Coine was a model for all Oregonians to follow in community service and
22 helping others in need; and

23 Whereas Ronald S. Coine was a mentor to many, training scores of new law enforcement offi-
24 cers, many of whom went on to full-time service or continued volunteer service in communities in
25 Oregon and elsewhere; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

28 to Ronald S. Coine's family, friends, students, coworkers and all those persons whose lives he af-
