

# House Concurrent Resolution 10

Sponsored by Representative HANNA, Senator FERRIOLI; Representatives ACKERMAN, BARNHART, BEYER, FARR, KRIEGER, MORGAN, Senators KRUSE, MORRISETTE, PROZANSKI, WALKER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

In memoriam: Former state Representative L. L. "Stub" Stewart.

## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 Whereas L. L. "Stub" Stewart, one of Oregon's most dedicated and distinguished citizens, died  
3 January 2, 2005, at the age of 93; and

4 Whereas "Stub" Stewart was born in Cottage Grove, Oregon, in 1911, graduated from high  
5 school there in 1928, earned his degree in logging engineering from Oregon Agricultural College,  
6 now Oregon State University, in 1932 and worked as an engineer with the United States Forest  
7 Service from 1933 until 1941 with postings in Lane County, John Day, Baker City and Lakeview; and

8 Whereas "Stub" Stewart valorously served his country during World War II as a field artillery  
9 officer in the United States Army; and

10 Whereas in 1946 "Stub" Stewart launched his career as "a giant in the Oregon timber  
11 business" when he and members of his family bought a small timber and lumber company and built  
12 it into a multimillion-dollar enterprise with more than 2,000 employees and mills throughout Oregon  
13 and northern California; and

14 Whereas "Stub" Stewart passionately believed that private success brought with it the obli-  
15 gation of public service; and

16 Whereas "Stub" Stewart served in the Oregon House of Representatives from 1951 to 1957, on  
17 the State Board of Higher Education from 1970 to 1977 and on various incarnations of the State  
18 Parks and Recreation Commission for 30 years, all the while "tending to business" as president and  
19 chairman of the board of the burgeoning and diversifying Bohemia Lumber Company; and

20 Whereas industry magnate "Stub" Stewart also has been credited with being the father of  
21 Oregon's landmark Beach Bill that protected public access to the state's beaches and with being a  
22 driving force behind efforts to expand Oregon's public parklands; and

23 Whereas "Stub" Stewart served on the boards and in leadership positions of myriad professional,  
24 charitable and community organizations and contributed generously, both as an individual and with  
25 members of his family, to philanthropic causes and Oregon's institutions of higher education; and

26 Whereas among the numerous appreciative recognitions bestowed upon "Stub" Stewart are  
27 Oregon State University's Distinguished Service Award, the University of Oregon's Pioneer Award,  
28 the First Citizen Award from the cities of Eugene and Cottage Grove and the Secretary of the In-  
29 terior Citation Award for Conservation Service; and

30 Whereas Governor Ted Kulongoski in a statement commemorating "Stub" Stewart's many years  
31 of public service recalled Winston Churchill's observation that "We make a living by what we get,

1 but we make a life by what we give”; now, therefore,

2 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

3 That we, the members of the Seventy-third Legislative Assembly, mourn the passing of L. L.  
4 “Stub” Stewart and honor his countless contributions to his nation, his state, his community and  
5 his fellow citizens; and be it further

6 Resolved, That a copy of this resolution be presented to his sons, LaSells “Bud” Stewart and  
7 Steven Stewart, and his sister, Dorothy Chapman Stewart, as an expression of our esteem.
