

# House Joint Resolution 15

Sponsored by Representative TOMEI, Senator JOHNSON

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Crisis Intervention Training.

## JOINT RESOLUTION

**Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

(1) There is created the Task Force on Crisis Intervention Training consisting of 18 members appointed as follows:

(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:

(A) Two members from among members of the Senate.

(B) Seven members who are representatives of county sheriffs, city chiefs of police, community mental health programs, county commissioners, city councilors and mental health and criminal justice advocacy organizations.

(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:

(A) Two members from among members of the House of Representatives.

(B) Seven members who are representatives of county sheriffs, city chiefs of police, community mental health programs, county commissioners, city councilors and mental health and criminal justice advocacy organizations.

(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

(3) The task force shall:

(a) Develop a plan to expand crisis intervention training in communities throughout the state; and

(b) Study ways of providing crisis intervention training for public safety personnel and mental health professionals.

(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.

(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.

(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

(10) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to

1 an interim committee related to mental health or the judiciary no later than October 1, 2006.

2 (11) The Legislative Administrator shall provide staff support to the task force.

3 (12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not enti-  
4 tled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

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
