SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Extends sunset on Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council to January 2, 2010. Authorizes payment of expenses of members of council from contributions. Requires reports to Legislative Assembly.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council; creating new provisions; amending
3 sections 1 and 2, chapter 699, Oregon Laws 2001; and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 1, chapter 699, Oregon Laws 2001, as amended by section 3, chapter 775,
6 Oregon Laws 2003, is amended to read:

7 **Sec. 1.** (1) There is established the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council consisting
8 of 20 members.

9 (2) The Governor shall appoint one member to represent each of the following entities, and in
10 making the appointments under this subsection shall give consideration to recommendations made
11 by the entity the member is to represent:

12 (a) The Central Oregon Telecommunications Task Force.

13 (b) CoastNet.

14 (c) The Eastern Oregon Telecommunications Consortium.

15 (d) The Fiber South Consortium.

16 (e) Frontier Telenet.

17 (f) The Gorge Teleconsortium.

18 (g) The Regional Fiber Consortium (Lane and Klamath Counties).

19 (h) The North Coast Telecommunications Consortium.

20 (i) The South Coast Telecommunications Consortium.

21 (j) The Southern Oregon Telecommunications and Technology Council.

22 (3) The Governor shall appoint two members of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
23 Council to represent the counties of this state. The Governor shall give consideration to recom-
24 mendations made by the Association of Oregon Counties in making the appointments under this
25 subsection.

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 (4) The Governor shall appoint two members of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
2 Council to represent the cities of this state. The Governor shall give consideration to recommen-
3 dations made by the League of Oregon Cities in making the appointments under this subsection.

4 (5) The Governor shall appoint two members of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
5 Council to represent telecommunication utilities and Internet service providers in this state. The
6 Governor shall give consideration to recommendations made by the Oregon Telecommunications
7 Association in making the appointments under this subsection.

8 (6) The Governor shall appoint one member of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
9 Council to represent Oregon tribes. The Governor shall give consideration to recommendations made
10 by the Commission on Indian Services in making the appointment under this subsection.

11 (7) The Governor shall appoint one member of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
12 Council to represent elementary and secondary schools. The Governor shall give consideration to
13 recommendations made by the Oregon School Boards Association in making the appointment under
14 this subsection.

15 (8) The Governor shall appoint one member of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
16 Council to represent community colleges. The Governor shall give consideration to recommendations
17 made by the Oregon Community College Association in making the appointment under this sub-
18 section.

19 (9) The Governor shall appoint one member of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating
20 Council to represent the Oregon University System. The Governor shall give consideration to rec-
21 ommendations made by the Chancellor of the Oregon University System in making the appointment
22 under this subsection.

23 (10) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council may by a majority vote of the
24 council add members to the council to represent telecommunication consortia coming into existence
25 after January 1, 2003, or to represent citizen groups recognized by the council.

26 (11) If no additional funds are required, the Economic and Community Development Department,
27 the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the League of Oregon Cities and the Association
28 of Oregon Counties may provide staff to the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council.

29 (12) Members of the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council are not entitled to com-
30 pensation [*and expenses and shall serve on the council on a volunteer basis*], **but may be paid ex-**
31 **penses if funding is available from contributions under subsection (15) of this section.**

32 (13) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council shall study alternative approaches
33 to providing coordinated statewide, regional and local telecommunication services, including pro-
34 viding services to unserved or underserved areas of the state. In addition, the council shall study
35 the manner in which telecommunication investments can be coordinated to facilitate partnerships
36 between the public sector and the private sector and between state and local governments. The
37 council shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and to the Joint Legislative
38 Committee on Information Management and Technology before each legislative session.

39 (14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the
40 Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council in the performance of its functions and, to the
41 extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the
42 members of the council consider necessary to perform their functions.

43 (15) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council may accept contributions of funds
44 and assistance from the United States or its agencies or from any other source, public or private,
45 and agree to conditions thereon not inconsistent with the purposes of the council. All such funds

1 are to aid in financing the functions of the council and [may] **shall** be deposited in the General Fund
2 of the State Treasury to the credit of separate accounts for the council to disburse for the purpose
3 for which contributed in the same manner as funds appropriated for the council.

4 (16) Official action by the Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council requires the ap-
5 proval of a majority of the members. The council may recommend legislation, and all legislation
6 recommended by the council must indicate that it is introduced at the request of the council. Leg-
7 islation recommended by the council must be submitted to the Joint Legislative Committee on In-
8 formation Management and Technology. The legislation shall be prepared in time for presession
9 filing at regular sessions of the Legislative Assembly.

10 (17) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council shall:

11 (a) Encourage the work of regional telecommunications consortia that have emerged throughout
12 the state.

13 (b) Encourage state agencies to utilize telecommunications.

14 (c) Encourage efforts to provide cost-effective, quality workforce development training using
15 telecommunications infrastructure and facilities to access distance learning opportunities.

16 (d) Encourage schools, education service districts and local education agencies in unserved
17 areas to promote broadband access for the surrounding community.

18 (e) Encourage public and private entities to seek opportunities for partnership with educational
19 institutions that will stimulate the use of broadband technologies through community projects and
20 public education.

21 (f) Recommend ways for the State of Oregon to support innovative efforts that build effective
22 and cost-efficient delivery of distance education supported by telecommunications.

23 (g) Encourage the Oregon Telehealth Alliance to continue the work of the council's Telehealth
24 Committee.

25 (h) Facilitate public and private organizations working together in partnership to promote the
26 use of telecommunications infrastructure and new technology.

27 **SECTION 2.** Section 2, chapter 699, Oregon Laws 2001, as amended by section 6, chapter 775,
28 Oregon Laws 2003, is amended to read:

29 **Sec. 2.** Section 1, chapter 699, Oregon Laws 2001, is repealed on January 2, [2006] 2010.

30 **SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council shall report to the**
31 **Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, no later than**
32 **February 1, 2007. The report shall include information on the implementation of the plan**
33 **described in section 4, chapter 775, Oregon Laws 2003.**

34 **(2) The Oregon Telecommunications Coordinating Council shall report to the Seventy-**
35 **fifth Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, no later than February**
36 **1, 2009. The report shall include information on the implementation of the plan described in**
37 **section 4, chapter 775, Oregon Laws 2003.**

38 **SECTION 4. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
39 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect**
40 **on its passage.**
