SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates crime of dumping methamphetamine waste. Punishes by maximum of 20 years' imprisonment, \$375,000 fine, or both.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to methamphetamine waste.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2005 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475.940 to**
5 **475.999.**

6 **SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the crime of dumping methamphetamine waste if the**
7 **person knowingly deposits on any property a precursor substance, chemical waste or debris,**
8 **used in or resulting from the manufacture of methamphetamine or the preparation of a**
9 **precursor substance for the manufacture of methamphetamine.**

10 **(2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to the disposal of waste products:**

11 **(a) By a licensed pharmaceutical company in the normal course of business; or**

12 **(b) Pursuant to state or federal laws regulating the cleanup or disposal of waste products**
13 **from unlawful methamphetamine manufacturing.**

14 **(3) Dumping methamphetamine waste is a Class A felony.**
