

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO SENATE BILL 924

1 On page 8 of the printed bill, delete lines 14 through 16 and insert:

2 **“SECTION 2. If Senate Bill 925 becomes law, section 1 of this 2005 Act (amending ORS**
3 **742.504) is repealed and ORS 742.504, as amended by section 1, chapter __, Oregon Laws 2005**
4 **(Enrolled Senate Bill 925), is amended to read:**

5 “742.504. Every policy required to provide the coverage specified in ORS 742.502 shall provide
6 uninsured motorist coverage that in each instance is no less favorable in any respect to the insured
7 or the beneficiary than if the following provisions were set forth in the policy. However, nothing
8 contained in this section requires the insurer to reproduce in the policy the particular language of
9 any of the following provisions:

10 “(1)(a) The insurer will pay all sums that the insured, the heirs or the legal representative of
11 the insured is legally entitled to recover as general and special damages from the owner or operator
12 of an uninsured vehicle because of bodily injury sustained by the insured caused by accident and
13 arising out of the ownership, maintenance or use of the uninsured vehicle. Determination as to
14 whether the insured, the insured’s heirs or the insured’s legal representative is legally entitled to
15 recover such damages, and if so, the amount thereof, shall be made by agreement between the in-
16 sured and the insurer, or, in the event of disagreement, may be determined by arbitration as pro-
17 vided in subsection (10) of this section.

18 “(b) No judgment against any person or organization alleged to be legally responsible for bodily
19 injury, except for proceedings instituted against the insurer as provided in this policy, shall be
20 conclusive, as between the insured and the insurer, on the issues of liability of the person or or-
21 ganization or of the amount of damages to which the insured is legally entitled.

22 “(2) As used in this policy:

23 “(a) ‘Bodily injury’ means bodily injury, sickness or disease, including death resulting therefrom.

24 “(b) ‘Hit-and-run vehicle’ means a vehicle that causes bodily injury to an insured arising out of
25 physical contact of the vehicle with the insured or with a vehicle the insured is occupying at the
26 time of the accident, provided:

27 “(A) The identity of either the operator or the owner of the hit-and-run vehicle cannot be as-
28 certained;

29 “(B) The insured or someone on behalf of the insured reported the accident within 72 hours to
30 a police, peace or judicial officer, to the Department of Transportation or to the equivalent depart-
31 ment in the state where the accident occurred, and filed with the insurer within 30 days thereafter
32 a statement under oath that the insured or the legal representative of the insured has a cause or
33 causes of action arising out of the accident for damages against a person or persons whose identities
34 are unascertainable, and setting forth the facts in support thereof; and

35 “(C) At the insurer’s request, the insured or the legal representative of the insured makes

1 available for inspection the vehicle the insured was occupying at the time of the accident.

2 “(c) ‘Insured,’ when unqualified and when applied to uninsured motorist coverage, means:

3 “(A) The named insured as stated in the policy and any person designated as named insured in
4 the schedule and, while residents of the same household, the spouse of any named insured and rel-
5 atives of either, provided that neither the relative nor the spouse is the owner of a vehicle not de-
6 scribed in the policy and that, if the named insured as stated in the policy is other than an
7 individual or husband and wife who are residents of the same household, the named insured shall
8 be only a person so designated in the schedule;

9 “(B) Any child residing in the household of the named insured if the insured has performed the
10 duties of a parent to the child by rearing the child as the insured’s own although the child is not
11 related to the insured by blood, marriage or adoption; and

12 “(C) Any other person while occupying an insured vehicle, provided the actual use thereof is
13 with the permission of the named insured.

14 “(d) ‘Insured vehicle,’ except as provided in paragraph (e) of this provision, means:

15 “(A) The vehicle described in the policy or a newly acquired or substitute vehicle, as each of
16 those terms is defined in the public liability coverage of the policy, insured under the public liability
17 provisions of the policy; or

18 “(B) A nonowned vehicle operated by the named insured or spouse if a resident of the same
19 household, provided that the actual use thereof is with the permission of the owner of the vehicle
20 and the vehicle is not owned by nor furnished for the regular or frequent use of the insured or any
21 member of the same household.

22 “(e) ‘Insured vehicle’ does not include a trailer of any type unless the trailer is a described ve-
23 hicle in the policy.

24 “(f) ‘Occupying’ means in or upon or entering into or alighting from.

25 “(g) ‘Phantom vehicle’ means a vehicle that causes bodily injury to an insured arising out of a
26 motor vehicle accident that is caused by a vehicle that has no physical contact with the insured or
27 the vehicle the insured is occupying at the time of the accident, provided:

28 “(A) The identity of either the operator or the owner of the phantom vehicle cannot be ascer-
29 tained;

30 “(B) The facts of the accident can be corroborated by competent evidence other than the testi-
31 mony of the insured or any person having an uninsured motorist claim resulting from the accident;
32 and

33 “(C) The insured or someone on behalf of the insured reported the accident within 72 hours to
34 a police, peace or judicial officer, to the Department of Transportation or to the equivalent depart-
35 ment in the state where the accident occurred, and filed with the insurer within 30 days thereafter
36 a statement under oath that the insured or the legal representative of the insured has a cause or
37 causes of action arising out of the accident for damages against a person or persons whose identities
38 are unascertainable, and setting forth the facts in support thereof.

39 “(h) ‘State’ includes the District of Columbia, a territory or possession of the United States and
40 a province of Canada.

41 **“(i) ‘Stolen vehicle’ means an insured vehicle that causes bodily injury to the insured**
42 **arising out of a motor vehicle accident if:**

43 **“(A) The vehicle is operated without the consent of the insured;**

44 **“(B) The operator of the vehicle does not have collectible motor vehicle bodily injury li-**
45 **ability insurance;**

1 “(C) **The insured or someone on behalf of the insured reported the accident within 72**
2 **hours to a police, peace or judicial officer or to the equivalent department in the state where**
3 **the accident occurred; and**

4 “(D) **The insured or someone on behalf of the insured cooperates with the appropriate law**
5 **enforcement agency in the prosecution of the theft of the vehicle.**

6 “[(i)] (j) ‘Uninsured vehicle,’ except as provided in paragraph [(j)] (k) of this provision, means:

7 “(A) A vehicle with respect to the ownership, maintenance or use of which there is no collect-
8 ible motor vehicle bodily injury liability insurance, in at least the amounts or limits prescribed for
9 bodily injury or death under ORS 806.070 applicable at the time of the accident with respect to any
10 person or organization legally responsible for the use of the vehicle, or with respect to which there
11 is collectible bodily injury liability insurance applicable at the time of the accident but the insur-
12 ance company writing the insurance denies coverage or, within two years of the date of the acci-
13 dent, the company writing the insurance becomes voluntarily or involuntarily declared bankrupt or
14 for which a receiver is appointed or becomes insolvent. It shall be a disputable presumption that a
15 vehicle is uninsured in the event the insured and the insurer, after reasonable efforts, fail to dis-
16 cover within 90 days from the date of the accident, the existence of a valid and collectible motor
17 vehicle bodily injury liability insurance applicable at the time of the accident.

18 “(B) A hit-and-run vehicle.

19 “(C) A phantom vehicle.

20 “(D) **A stolen vehicle.**

21 “[(j)] (k) ‘Uninsured vehicle’ does not include:

22 “(A) An insured vehicle, **unless the vehicle is a stolen vehicle;**

23 “(B) A vehicle that is owned or operated by a self-insurer within the meaning of any motor ve-
24 hicle financial responsibility law, motor carrier law or any similar law;

25 “(C) A vehicle that is owned by the United States of America, Canada, a state, a political sub-
26 division of any such government or an agency of any such government;

27 “(D) A land motor vehicle or trailer, if operated on rails or crawler-treads or while located for
28 use as a residence or premises and not as a vehicle;

29 “(E) A farm-type tractor or equipment designed for use principally off public roads, except while
30 actually upon public roads; or

31 “(F) A vehicle owned by or furnished for the regular or frequent use of the insured or any
32 member of the household of the insured.

33 “[(k)] (L) ‘Vehicle’ means every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may
34 be transported or drawn upon a public highway, but does not include devices moved by human
35 power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

36 “(3) This coverage applies only to accidents that occur on and after the effective date of the
37 policy, during the policy period and within the United States of America, its territories or pos-
38 sessions, or Canada.

39 “(4)(a) This coverage does not apply to bodily injury of an insured with respect to which the
40 insured or the legal representative of the insured shall, without the written consent of the insurer,
41 make any settlement with or prosecute to judgment any action against any person or organization
42 who may be legally liable therefor.

43 “(b) This coverage does not apply to bodily injury to an insured while occupying a vehicle, other
44 than an insured vehicle, owned by, or furnished for the regular use of, the named insured or any
45 relative resident in the same household, or through being struck by the vehicle.

1 “(c) This coverage does not apply so as to inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of any
2 workers’ compensation carrier, any person or organization qualifying as a self-insurer under any
3 workers’ compensation or disability benefits law or any similar law or the State Accident Insurance
4 Fund Corporation.

5 “(d) This coverage does not apply with respect to underinsured motorist benefits unless:

6 “(A) The limits of liability under any bodily injury liability insurance applicable at the time of
7 the accident regarding the injured person have been exhausted by payment of judgments or settle-
8 ments to the injured person or other injured persons;

9 “(B) The described limits have been offered in settlement, the insurer has refused consent under
10 paragraph (a) of this subsection and the insured protects the insurer’s right of subrogation to the
11 claim against the tortfeasor;

12 “(C) The insured gives credit to the insurer for the unrealized portion of the described liability
13 limits as if the full limits had been received if less than the described limits have been offered in
14 settlement, and the insurer has consented under paragraph (a) of this subsection; or

15 “(D) The insured gives credit to the insurer for the unrealized portion of the described liability
16 limits as if the full limits had been received if less than the described limits have been offered in
17 settlement and, if the insurer has refused consent under paragraph (a) of this subsection, the insured
18 protects the insurer’s right of subrogation to the claim against the tortfeasor.

19 “(e) When seeking consent under paragraph (a) or (d) of this subsection, the insured shall allow
20 the insurer a reasonable time in which to collect and evaluate information related to consent to the
21 proposed offer of settlement. The insured shall provide promptly to the insurer any information that
22 is reasonably requested by the insurer and that is within the custody and control of the insured.
23 Consent will be presumed to be given if the insurer does not respond within a reasonable time. For
24 purposes of this paragraph, a ‘reasonable time’ is no more than 30 days from the insurer’s receipt
25 of a written request for consent, unless the insured and the insurer agree otherwise.

26 “(5)(a) As soon as practicable, the insured or other person making claim shall give to the insurer
27 written proof of claim, under oath if required, including full particulars of the nature and extent of
28 the injuries, treatment and other details entering into the determination of the amount payable
29 hereunder. The insured and every other person making claim hereunder shall submit to examinations
30 under oath by any person named by the insurer and subscribe the same, as often as may reasonably
31 be required. Proof of claim shall be made upon forms furnished by the insurer unless the insurer fails
32 to furnish the forms within 15 days after receiving notice of claim.

33 “(b) Upon reasonable request of and at the expense of the insurer, the injured person shall
34 submit to physical examinations by physicians selected by the insurer and shall, upon each request
35 from the insurer, execute authorization to enable the insurer to obtain medical reports and copies
36 of records.

37 “(6) If, before the insurer makes payment of loss hereunder, the insured or the legal represen-
38 tative of the insured institutes any legal action for bodily injury against any person or organization
39 legally responsible for the use of a vehicle involved in the accident, a copy of the summons and
40 complaint or other process served in connection with the legal action shall be forwarded imme-
41 diately to the insurer by the insured or the legal representative of the insured.

42 “(7)(a) The limit of liability stated in the declarations as applicable to ‘each person’ is the limit
43 of the insurer’s liability for all damages because of bodily injury sustained by one person as the
44 result of any one accident and, subject to the above provision respecting each person, the limit of
45 liability stated in the declarations as applicable to ‘each accident’ is the total limit of the company’s

1 liability for all damages because of bodily injury sustained by two or more persons as the result of
2 any one accident.

3 “(b) Any payment made under this coverage to or for an insured shall be applied in reduction
4 of any amount that the insured may be entitled to recover from any person who is an insured under
5 the bodily injury liability coverage of this policy.

6 “(c) Any amount payable under the terms of this coverage because of bodily injury sustained in
7 an accident by a person who is an insured under this coverage shall be reduced by:

8 “(A) All sums paid on account of the bodily injury by or on behalf of the owner or operator of
9 the uninsured vehicle and by or on behalf of any other person or organization jointly or severally
10 liable together with the owner or operator for the bodily injury, including all sums paid under the
11 bodily injury liability coverage of the policy; and

12 “(B) The amount paid and the present value of all amounts payable on account of the bodily
13 injury under any workers’ compensation law, disability benefits law or any similar law.

14 “(d) Any amount payable under the terms of this coverage because of bodily injury sustained in
15 an accident by a person who is an insured under this coverage shall be reduced by the credit given
16 to the insurer pursuant to subsection (4)(d)(C) or (D) of this section.

17 “(e) The amount payable under the terms of this coverage may not be reduced by the amount
18 of liability proceeds offered, described in subsection (4)(d)(B) or (D) of this section, that has not been
19 paid to the injured person. If liability proceeds have been offered and not paid, the amount payable
20 under the terms of the coverage shall include the amount of liability limits offered but not accepted
21 due to the insurer’s refusal to consent. The insured shall cooperate so as to permit the insurer to
22 proceed by subrogation or assignment to prosecute the claim against the uninsured motorist.

23 “(8) No action shall lie against the insurer unless, as a condition precedent thereto, the insured
24 or the legal representative of the insured has fully complied with all the terms of this policy.

25 “(9)(a) With respect to bodily injury to an insured:

26 “(A) While occupying a vehicle owned by a named insured under this coverage, the insurance
27 under this coverage is primary.

28 “(B) While occupying a vehicle not owned by a named insured under this coverage, the insur-
29 ance under this coverage shall apply only as excess insurance over any primary insurance available
30 to the occupant that is similar to this coverage, and this excess insurance shall then apply only in
31 the amount by which the applicable limit of liability of this excess coverage exceeds the sum of the
32 applicable limits of liability of all primary insurance available to the occupant.

33 “(b) If an insured is an insured under other primary or excess insurance available to the insured
34 that is similar to this coverage, then the insured’s damages are deemed not to exceed the higher of
35 the applicable limits of liability of the additional primary or excess insurance available to the in-
36 sured, and the insurer is not liable under this coverage for a greater proportion of the insured’s
37 damages than the applicable limit of liability of this coverage bears to the sum of the applicable
38 limits of liability of this insurance and other primary or excess insurance available to the insured.

39 “(c) With respect to bodily injury to an insured while occupying any motor vehicle used as a
40 public or livery conveyance, the insurance under this coverage shall apply only as excess insurance
41 over any other insurance available to the insured that is similar to this coverage, and this insurance
42 shall then apply only in the amount by which the applicable limit of liability of this coverage ex-
43 ceeds the sum of the applicable limits of liability of all other insurance.

44 “(10) If any person making claim hereunder and the insurer do not agree that the person is le-
45 gally entitled to recover damages from the owner or operator of an uninsured vehicle because of

1 bodily injury to the insured, or do not agree as to the amount of payment that may be owing under
2 this coverage, then, in the event the insured and the insurer elect by mutual agreement at the time
3 of the dispute to settle the matter by arbitration, the arbitration shall take place under the arbi-
4 tration laws of the State of Oregon or, if the parties agree, according to any other procedure. Any
5 judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdic-
6 tion thereof, provided, however, that the costs to the insured of the arbitration proceeding do not
7 exceed \$100 and that all other costs of arbitration are borne by the insurer. 'Costs' as used in this
8 provision does not include attorney fees or expenses incurred in the production of evidence or wit-
9 nesses or the making of transcripts of the arbitration proceedings. The person and the insurer each
10 agree to consider themselves bound and to be bound by any award made by the arbitrators pursuant
11 to this coverage in the event of such election. At the election of the insured, the arbitration shall
12 be held:

13 “(a) In the county and state of residence of the insured;

14 “(b) In the county and state where the insured’s cause of action against the uninsured motorist
15 arose; or

16 “(c) At any other place mutually agreed upon by the insured and the insurer.

17 “(11) In the event of payment to any person under this coverage:

18 “(a) The insurer shall be entitled to the extent of the payment to the proceeds of any settlement
19 or judgment that may result from the exercise of any rights of recovery of the person against any
20 uninsured motorist legally responsible for the bodily injury because of which payment is made;

21 “(b) The person shall hold in trust for the benefit of the insurer all rights of recovery that the
22 person shall have against such other uninsured person or organization because of the damages that
23 are the subject of claim made under this coverage, but only to the extent that the claim is made or
24 paid herein;

25 “(c) If the insured is injured by the joint or concurrent act or acts of two or more persons, one
26 or more of whom is uninsured, the insured shall have the election to receive from the insurer any
27 payment to which the insured would be entitled under this coverage by reason of the act or acts
28 of the uninsured motorist, or the insured may, with the written consent of the insurer, proceed with
29 legal action against any or all persons claimed to be liable to the insured for the injuries. If the
30 insured elects to receive payment from the insurer under this coverage, then the insured shall hold
31 in trust for the benefit of the insurer all rights of recovery the insured shall have against any other
32 person, firm or organization because of the damages that are the subject of claim made under this
33 coverage, but only to the extent of the actual payment made by the insurer;

34 “(d) The person shall do whatever is proper to secure and shall do nothing after loss to preju-
35 dice such rights;

36 “(e) If requested in writing by the insurer, the person shall take, through any representative not
37 in conflict in interest with the person, designated by the insurer, such action as may be necessary
38 or appropriate to recover payment as damages from such other uninsured person or organization,
39 such action to be taken in the name of the person, but only to the extent of the payment made
40 hereunder. In the event of a recovery, the insurer shall be reimbursed out of the recovery for ex-
41 penses, costs and attorney fees incurred by the insurer in connection therewith; and

42 “(f) The person shall execute and deliver to the insurer any instruments and papers as may be
43 appropriate to secure the rights and obligations of the person and the insurer established by this
44 provision.

45 “(12)(a) The parties to this coverage agree that no cause of action shall accrue to the insured

1 under this coverage unless within two years from the date of the accident:

2 “(A) Agreement as to the amount due under the policy has been concluded;

3 “(B) The insured or the insurer has formally instituted arbitration proceedings;

4 “(C) The insured has filed an action against the insurer; or

5 “(D) Suit for bodily injury has been filed against the uninsured motorist and, within two years
6 from the date of settlement or final judgment against the uninsured motorist, the insured has
7 formally instituted arbitration proceedings or filed an action against the insurer.

8 “(b) For purposes of this subsection:

9 “(A) ‘Date of settlement’ means the date on which a written settlement agreement or release is
10 signed by an insured or, in the absence of these documents, the date on which the insured or the
11 attorney for the insured receives payment of any sum required by the settlement agreement. An
12 advance payment as defined in ORS 31.550 shall not be deemed a payment of a settlement for pur-
13 poses of the time limitation in this subsection.

14 “(B) ‘Final judgment’ means a judgment that has become final by lapse of time for appeal or by
15 entry in an appellate court of an appellate judgment.

16 “**SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 742.504 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2005 Act apply**
17 **to motor vehicle liability insurance policies issued or renewed on or after the effective date**
18 **of this 2005 Act.”.**

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
