SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Extends planning and advisory committee relating to improving health and well-being of children whose parents are involved in criminal justice system. **Adds representative from Oregon State Sheriffs' Association to committee.**

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to minors; amending section 16, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2001; and declaring an emer-
3 gency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 16, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2001, as amended by section 1, chapter 460,
6 Oregon Laws 2003, is amended to read:

7 **Sec. 16.** (1) For the [2003-2005] **2005-2007** biennium, there is created a planning and advisory
8 committee to make recommendations on how to improve the health and well-being of children whose
9 parents are involved in the criminal justice system.

10 (2) The planning and advisory committee shall have one representative from each of the fol-
11 lowing:

12 (a) The Department of Corrections, appointed by the Director of the Department of Corrections;

13 (b) The Oregon Youth Authority, appointed by the Director of the Oregon Youth Authority;

14 (c) The State Court Administrator, appointed by the administrator;

15 (d) The State Commission on Children and Families, appointed by the staff director of the State
16 Commission on Children and Families;

17 (e) The Department of Education, appointed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction;

18 (f) The Department of Human Services, appointed by the Director of Human Services; [and]

19 (g) The Oregon Youth Conservation Corps, appointed by the program director of the Oregon
20 Youth Conservation Corps[.]; **and**

21 **(h) The Oregon State Sheriffs' Association.**

22 (3) In addition to the representatives listed in subsection (2) of this section, the planning and
23 advisory committee shall solicit representatives from the following entities to join the committee:

24 (a) Local public safety coordinating councils;

25 (b) Local family law advisory committees;

26 (c) Local commissions on children and families;

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted.
New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

- 1 (d) Local public health agencies;
- 2 (e) Appropriate research and advocacy groups;
- 3 (f) [Local] Law enforcement agencies;
- 4 (g) Community corrections agencies;
- 5 (h) Community colleges;
- 6 (i) The Oregon University System; [and]
- 7 (j) Nonprofit organizations that provide services relevant to the work of the committee[.]; **and**
- 8 **(k) Public safety training programs.**

9 (4) In soliciting representatives under subsection (3) of this section, the planning and advisory
10 committee shall ensure that the representatives reflect the diversity of communities throughout the
11 state.

12 (5) The planning and advisory committee members shall jointly designate facilitators for the
13 committee.

14 (6)(a) The planning and advisory committee shall develop recommendations that address the
15 specific issues and problems faced by the children of parents involved in the following stages of the
16 criminal justice system:

- 17 (A) Arrest;
- 18 (B) Judicial proceedings;
- 19 (C) Incarceration in a local jail;
- 20 (D) Incarceration in a state prison; and
- 21 (E) Transition from incarceration into the community.

22 (b) When appropriate, the planning and advisory committee shall assist in the implementation
23 of its recommendations.

24 (c) No later than December 1, [2004] **2006**, the planning and advisory committee shall submit its
25 recommendations to the appropriate legislative interim committees and to the agencies listed in
26 subsection (2) of this section.

27 (7) The planning and advisory committee shall share its recommendations and the results of
28 implementation efforts with state and local governmental agencies and the public at large.

29 (8) The Department of Corrections shall provide staff support for the planning and advisory
30 committee.

31 **SECTION 2. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
32 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect**
33 **on its passage.**

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
