

# Senate Bill 1083

Sponsored by Senator SCHRADER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes credit against income or corporate excise taxes for wage increases paid by employers to employees engaged in activities that constitute farm use, when increases are caused by increase in minimum wage. Limits credit to percentage of wage increases paid.

Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2006.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to farm employment tax credits.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2005 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 315.**

5 **SECTION 2. (1) An individual taxpayer is allowed a credit against the taxes otherwise due**  
6 **under ORS chapter 316 or, if the taxpayer is a corporation, under ORS chapter 317 or 318 if:**

7 (a) **The taxpayer is primarily engaged in activities that constitute farm use under ORS**  
8 **215.203;**

9 (b) **The taxpayer employs one or more employees who are unrelated to the taxpayer ex-**  
10 **clusively in the activities described in paragraph (a) of this subsection; and**

11 (c) **The employees described in paragraph (b) of this subsection are employed at an hourly**  
12 **rate that equals or exceeds the hourly minimum wage as provided by law.**

13 (2)(a) **For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2006, and before January 1, 2007, the**  
14 **amount of the credit shall equal 50 percent of the wages paid during the tax year that are**  
15 **attributable to increases in the minimum wage required by law to be paid for employment**  
16 **in farming or ranching activities.**

17 (b) **For tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2007, the amount of the credit shall**  
18 **equal the wages paid during the tax year that are attributable to increases in the minimum**  
19 **wage required by ORS 653.025 to be paid for employment in farming or ranching activities.**

20 (3)(a) **Amounts paid by an employer that exceed the minimum wage but that are not at-**  
21 **tributable to increases in the minimum wage required by law do not qualify for a credit un-**  
22 **der this section.**

23 (b) **A taxpayer eligible for a credit under this section may sell or otherwise transfer the**  
24 **credit in exchange for cash payment.**

25 (c) **A transferee of a credit under this section shall be allowed the credit for the tax years**  
26 **that would have been allowable to the transferor had the transfer not occurred.**

27 (d) **The Department of Revenue shall establish by rule procedures for selling or otherwise**  
28 **transferring a credit under this section.**

29 (4) **Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, the credit allowed under this**  
30 **section may not exceed the liability of the taxpayer for the tax year.**

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1       (5) Any tax credit otherwise allowable under this section that is not used by the taxpayer  
2 in a particular tax year may be carried forward and offset against the taxpayer's tax liability  
3 for the next succeeding tax year. Any credit remaining unused in the next tax year may be  
4 carried forward and used in the second succeeding tax year, and likewise, any credit not used  
5 in that second succeeding tax year may be carried forward and used in the third succeeding  
6 tax year, and any credit not used in that third succeeding tax year may be carried forward  
7 and used in the fourth succeeding tax year, and any credit not used in that fourth succeeding  
8 tax year may be carried forward and used in the fifth succeeding tax year, but may not be  
9 carried forward for any tax year thereafter.

10       (6) A nonresident shall be allowed the credit under this section in the proportion provided  
11 in ORS 316.117.

12       (7) If a change in the status of a taxpayer from resident to nonresident or from nonres-  
13 ident to resident occurs, the credit allowed by this section shall be determined in a manner  
14 consistent with ORS 316.117.

15       (8) A husband and wife who file separate returns for a taxable year may each claim a  
16 share of the tax credit that would have been allowed on a joint return in proportion to the  
17 contribution of each.

18       (9) If a change in the taxable year of a taxpayer occurs as described in ORS 314.085, or  
19 if the Department of Revenue terminates the taxpayer's taxable year under ORS 314.440, the  
20 credit allowed under this section shall be prorated or computed in a manner consistent with  
21 ORS 314.085.

22       SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2005 Act applies to tax years beginning on or after January  
23 1, 2006.
