SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Transfers exclusive control of and jurisdiction over county roads within City of Gresham from Multnomah County to City of Gresham. **Directs Multnomah County and City of Gresham to enter into agreement concerning distribution of road funds.** Requires Multnomah County to transfer **specified** portion of road funds to City of Gresham **if agreement not entered into by specified date.** Creates advisory committee to recommend allocation of road funds to Troutdale, Wood Village and Fairview. Defines "road funds."

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to transfer of jurisdiction over certain Multnomah County roads to City of Gresham.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "road funds" means:**

5 (a) State Highway Fund moneys allocated to Multnomah County as provided in ORS
6 **366.739; and**

7 (b) Taxes imposed on motor vehicle fuel by Multnomah County.

8 (2) The county roads within the corporate limits of the City of Gresham, in Multnomah
9 County, are transferred and designated to be within the exclusive control and jurisdiction
10 of the City of Gresham. These county roads are city streets, subject to all of the burdens
11 and servitudes of city streets. Multnomah County does not have control of or jurisdiction
12 over the roads described in this subsection.

13 (3) Multnomah County and the City of Gresham shall enter into an agreement concerning
14 the distribution of the total road funds of the county. When Multnomah County and the City
15 of Gresham have reached an agreement, they shall notify the Oregon Transportation Com-
16 mission and the Office of the Legislative Counsel.

17 **SECTION 2. Multnomah County shall transfer annually to the City of Gresham a share**
18 **of the State Highway Fund moneys allocated to the county as provided in ORS 366.739 that**
19 **is equal to the total road funds of the county, less road funds transferred to other jurisdic-**
20 **tions under intergovernmental agreements entered into before the effective date of this 2005**
21 **Act, multiplied by the percentage share of county road center line miles transferred to the**
22 **City of Gresham under section 1 of this 2005 Act.**

23 **SECTION 3. (1) As a result of the transfer of jurisdiction over county roads under section**
24 **1 of this 2005 Act and the transfer of moneys under section 1 or section 2 of this 2005 Act,**
25 **an advisory committee is created.**

1 **(2) The advisory committee shall recommend to the governing body of Multnomah County**
2 **the appropriate allocation of road funds, as defined in section 1 of this 2005 Act, to the Cities**
3 **of Troutdale, Wood Village and Fairview. The recommendation shall be based on the indi-**
4 **vidual needs of each of those cities.**

5 **(3) The advisory committee shall consist of:**

6 **(a) One representative from Multnomah County;**

7 **(b) One representative from the City of Gresham;**

8 **(c) One representative from the City of Troutdale;**

9 **(d) One representative from the City of Wood Village; and**

10 **(e) One representative from the City of Fairview.**

11 **SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2005 Act becomes operative only if Multnomah County and**
12 **the City of Gresham have not entered into an agreement as provided in section 1 of this 2005**
13 **Act on or before December 31, 2005.**
