

B-Engrossed Senate Bill 5602

Ordered by the House July 26
Including Senate Amendments dated June 22 and House Amendments

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

- Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Secretary of State for certain biennial expenses.
- Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Secretary of State.
- Limits certain biennial expenditures by Secretary of State from federal funds.
- Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board for allocation to Secretary of State for certain biennial expenses.
- Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2005.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Secretary of State, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for the following purposes:

- (1) **Executive Office..... \$ 288,001**
- (2) **Elections Division \$ 3,842,335**
- (3) **Business Services Division..... \$ 286,533**
- (4) **Information Systems Division .. \$ 1,080,564**
- (5) **Human Resources Division \$ 57,231**
- (6) **Archives Division..... \$ 3,488,642**
- (7) **Help America Vote Act..... \$ 700,000**

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Secretary of State, for the following purposes:

- (1) **Executive Office..... \$ 1,092,793**
- (2) **Elections Division \$ 119,748**
- (3) **Business Services Division..... \$ 2,440,715**
- (4) **Information Systems Division .. \$ 6,505,334**
- (5) **Human Resources Division \$ 483,676**
- (6) **Audits Division..... \$ 12,998,843**

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

- 1 (7) Archives Division..... \$ 2,312,065
- 2 (8) Corporation Division..... \$ 6,821,734
- 3 (9) Help America Vote Act..... \$ 700,000

4 **SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
5 \$5,151,955 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for
6 payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Secretary of State for
7 the purposes of implementing the Help America Vote Act.

8 **SECTION 4.** (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
9 priated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General
10 Fund, the amount of \$1,000,000, to be allocated to the Secretary of State for the production
11 and distribution of voters' pamphlets for the 2006 primary and general elections.

12 (2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated
13 by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2006, the moneys remaining on that date be-
14 come available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

15 **SECTION 5.** This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
16 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect
17 July 1, 2005.
