

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5611

1 Delete lines 5 through 18 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Legislative Administration Committee, for**
3 **the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the following amounts for**
4 **payment of the expenses of the Legislative Administration Committee for the following pur-**
5 **poses:**

6 (1) General program..... \$ 20,078,626

7 (2) Committees and task

8 forces \$ 77,552

9 (3) Debt service \$ 1,428,927

10 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
11 **\$4,357,311 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**
12 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**
13 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Legislative Ad-**
14 **ministration Committee.**

15 **“SECTION 3. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, expenditures by the Legislative**
16 **Administration Committee from the Stores Revolving Account and the Property and Supplies**
17 **Stores Account established by ORS 173.790 are not limited.**

18 **“SECTION 4. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, including the**
19 **appropriation made by subsection (2) of this section, any difference between the amount ap-**
20 **propriated by section 65 (1), chapter 710, Oregon Laws 2003, and the amount actually ex-**
21 **pended within the appropriation on or before June 30, 2005, is considered an appropriation for**
22 **payment of expenses of the regular session of the Seventy-third Legislative Assembly of the**
23 **State of Oregon for the period of the regular session after June 30, 2005.**

24 **“(2) There is appropriated to the Legislative Assembly, for the biennium beginning July**
25 **1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$15,972,929 for payment of the expenses of**
26 **the Seventy-third Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon.**

27 **“(3) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, including the appropriation**
28 **made by subsection (4) of this section, any difference between the amount appropriated by**
29 **subsection (2) of this section and the amount actually expended for payment of expenses of**
30 **the Seventy-third Legislative Assembly is considered an appropriation for payment of ex-**
31 **penses of the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon.**

32 **“(4) There is appropriated to the Legislative Assembly, for the biennium beginning July**
33 **1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$10,752,831 for payment of the expenses of**
34 **the Seventy-fourth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon.**

35 **“SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**

1 \$196,988 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for
2 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
3 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Legislative As-
4 sembly of the State of Oregon.

5 “SECTION 6. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, expenditures by the Legislative
6 Administration Committee from the Lounge Revolving Account established by ORS 171.117
7 for the costs of food served in members’ lounges and reimbursed through receipts on the
8 basis of sales or by payroll deductions from members are not limited.

9 “SECTION 7. There is appropriated to the Legislative Counsel Committee, for the
10 biennium beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$6,834,261.

11 “SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
12 \$1,118,734 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for
13 payment of expenses by the Legislative Counsel Committee from the ORS Revolving Account
14 established by ORS 171.305 for personnel costs connected with the editing of the Oregon Re-
15 vised Statutes.

16 “SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
17 \$116,982 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for
18 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
19 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Legislative Counsel
20 Committee from state agencies or other offices for bill drafting and any other legal services
21 authorized or required by law to be rendered by the Legislative Counsel Committee, including
22 duties under ORS 183.710 to 183.725 provided pursuant to policies established by the Legisla-
23 tive Counsel Committee.

24 “SECTION 10. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, expenditures by the Legislative
25 Counsel Committee from the ORS Revolving Account established by ORS 171.305 and from
26 the Legislative Publications Account established by ORS 171.245, for services and supplies
27 connected with printing and distributing legislative publications and the Oregon Revised
28 Statutes, are not limited.

29 “SECTION 11. There is appropriated to the Legislative Fiscal Officer, for the biennium
30 beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$4,597,509.

31 “SECTION 12. There is appropriated to the Legislative Revenue Officer, for the biennium
32 beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,553,007.

33 “SECTION 13. There is appropriated to the Commission on Indian Services, for the
34 biennium beginning July 1, 2005, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$336,284.

35 “SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$5,925
36 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of
37 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
38 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Commission on Indian
39 Services.

40 “SECTION 15. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
41 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect
42 July 1, 2005.”
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
