

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5626

By SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON BUDGET

July 6

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, delete “appropriating money;”.

2 Delete lines 5 through 18 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$69,920**  
4 **is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of**  
5 **expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**  
6 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Examiners of**  
7 **Licensed Dietitians.**

8 **“SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
9 **\$1,122,440 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
10 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**  
11 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Mortuary**  
12 **and Cemetery Board.**

13 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
14 **\$384,032 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
15 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**  
16 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of**  
17 **Naturopathic Examiners.**

18 **“SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
19 **\$202,807 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
20 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**  
21 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Examin-**  
22 **ers of Nursing Home Administrators.**

23 **“SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
24 **\$270,166 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
25 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**  
26 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Occupational**  
27 **Therapy Licensing Board.**

28 **“SECTION 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
29 **\$3,617,864 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
30 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**  
31 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of**  
32 **Pharmacy.**

33 **“SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**  
34 **\$469,429 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**  
35 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**

1 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of  
2 Radiologic Technology.

3 “SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
4 \$235,776 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for  
5 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,  
6 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of  
7 Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

8 “SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
9 \$514,282 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for  
10 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,  
11 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon State  
12 Veterinary Medical Examining Board.

13 “SECTION 10. This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
14 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect  
15 July 1, 2005.”
