SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Appropriates moneys from General Fund to _____ for biennial expenses.]

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by *[_____]* **Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians, State Mortuary and Cemetery Board, Board of Naturopathic Examiners, Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators, Occupational Therapy Licensing Board, State Board of Pharmacy, Board of Radiologic Technology, State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.**

[Limits biennial expenditures by _____ from federal funds.]

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2005.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$69,920**
5 **is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of**
6 **expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**
7 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Examiners of**
8 **Licensed Dietitians.**

9 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
10 **\$1,122,440 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for**
11 **payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,**
12 **but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Mortuary**
13 **and Cemetery Board.**

14 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$384,032**
15 **is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of**
16 **expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**
17 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Naturopathic**
18 **Examiners.**

19 **SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$202,807**
20 **is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of**
21 **expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-**
22 **cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Examiners of**
23 **Nursing Home Administrators.**

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

1 **SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$270,166
2 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of
3 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
4 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Occupational Therapy
5 Licensing Board.

6 **SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
7 \$3,617,864 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for
8 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
9 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of
10 Pharmacy.

11 **SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$469,429
12 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of
13 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
14 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Radiologic
15 Technology.

16 **SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$235,776
17 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of
18 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
19 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of Examin-
20 ers for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

21 **SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$514,282
22 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2005, as the maximum limit for payment of
23 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
24 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon State Veterinary
25 Medical Examining Board.

26 **SECTION 10.** This 2005 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
27 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2005 Act takes effect
28 July 1, 2005.
