**SB 1046 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Health Care) – Relating to prescriptive authority for licensed psychologists; declaring an emergency.**
