Legislative Quick Card



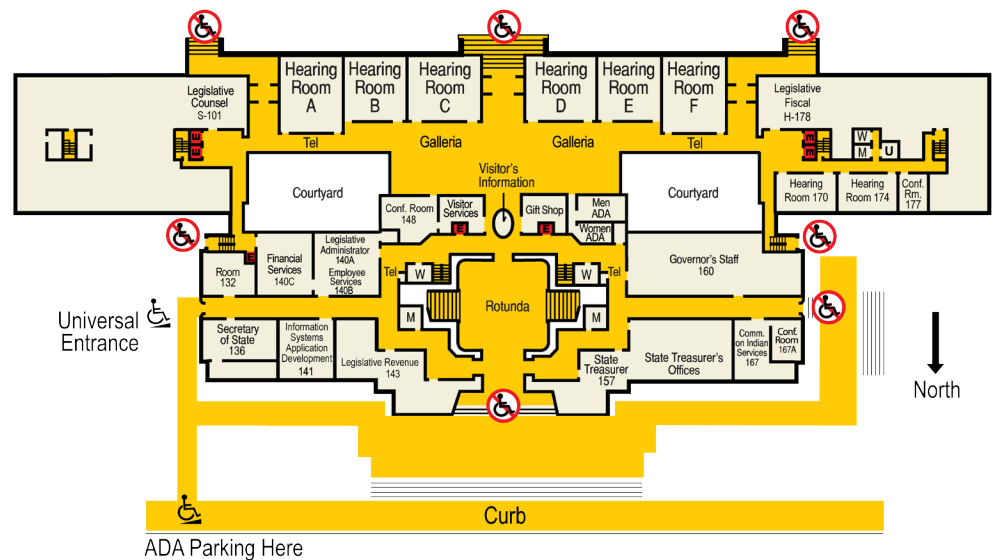
The Oregon State Legislature is committed to ensuring that all people have universal access to the building and legislative proceedings. Hearing rooms and the House and Senate Chambers offer universal access. Hearing assistance devices are available for all hearing rooms and both chambers.

ADA Information:

ADA accommodation requests should be directed to Karen Hupp, or Mary Rowinski, ADA Coordinators, at employee.services@state.or.us or by phone at 1-800-332-2313. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 72 hours in advance.

Wheelchair Entrance and Parking *(Picture below)*

- Disabled parking spaces are located on Court Street (north side of building). The passenger loading and unloading zone is located on Court Street directly in front of the steps.
- Powered doors and a ramp are located on the east side of the building with access gained from the front of the Capitol (Court Street).



Emergency Alarms

- Emergency alarms in the Capitol are equipped with flashing strobes for deaf and hard-of-hearing persons.

Restrooms

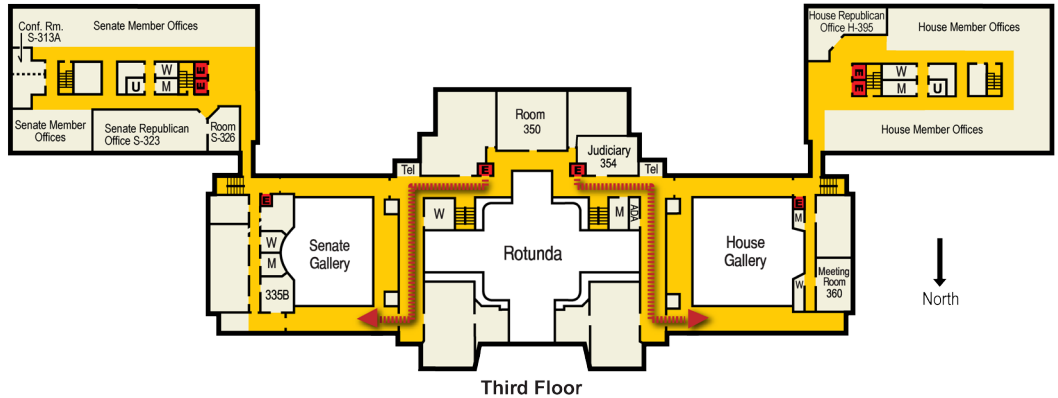
- **Unisex:** 2nd through 4th floors on the House and Senate Wings and on the 3rd floor, outside House Gallery.
- **Men:** Ground floor, west of Hearing Room 50 and on 1st floor by Kiosk.
- **Women:** Ground floor, east side of Hearing Room 50 and on 1st floor by Kiosk.

Chambers *(Layout to right)*

- Both the House and Senate Chambers have universal access in the Galleries located on the third floor. Please use the north side aisle of Gallery.

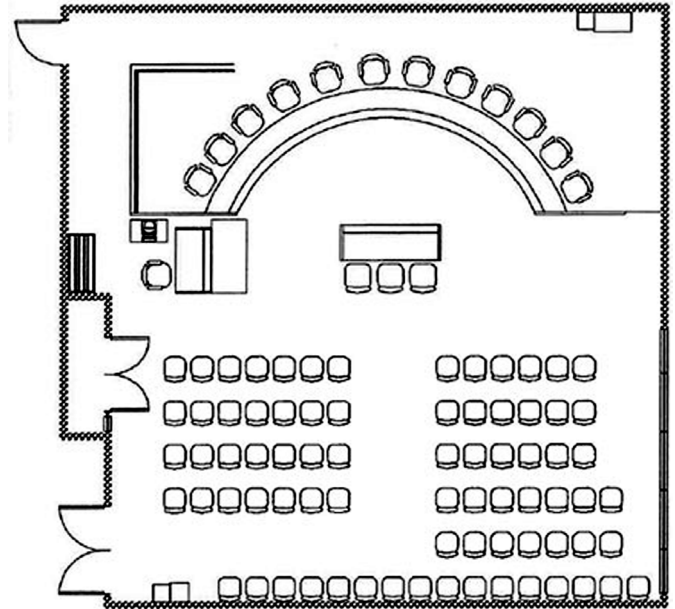


Hearing Assistance

- Hearing assistance devices (FM system) are available for use in all hearing rooms and both Chambers. Contact Visitor Services at the Kiosk or call 503-986-1388.

Hearing Rooms *(Layout to the right)*

- Hearing rooms are wheelchair accessible. If a large group of wheelchair users is planning to attend a specific meeting, please notify Legislative Administration at least 24-hours before the hearing, Room 140-A or call (503) 986-1848, so arrangements can be made for additional wheelchair space.



Testifying

- If special accommodation is required in order to testify before a committee, please contact the committee administrator or support staff at least 24-hours before the meeting with your request. Following are contact numbers: Legislative Committees (503) 986-1813 or 1-800-332-2313 (outside Salem)

Sign Language Interpreters

- Sign language interpreters are available for access to the legislative process. Contact Legislative Administration at (503) 986-1848 at least 72-hours in advance of need.

Compact Disks (CD)

- Recording logs of all legislative committee proceedings and floor sessions are available. Contact Committee Services, Room 453, or call 503-986-1813. CDs can be purchased for \$5.00 each.

Drinking Fountains

- The drinking fountains are located in the east and west ends of the Galleria. They are also on the 1st through 4th floors of the House Wing and the 2nd through 4th floors of the Senate Wing.

Elevators

- Elevators access all floors in the Capitol and can accommodate most wheelchairs.

- Hearing-assisted and wheelchair-accessible public telephones are located on the 1st floor, outside Hearing Room F.
- TTY is available on a public telephone located outside Hearing Room F.

Tours

- Historic Building Tours are wheelchair accessible.
