

You may be eligible for health insurance through the Oregon Health Plan

Oregon's health insurance program, the Oregon Health Plan (OHP), is changing. Beginning in late 2002, the Family Health Insurance Assistance Program (FHIAP) will start offering financial assistance to more low-income Oregonians so they can purchase health insurance through their employer or on their own. In early 2003, the OHP will also begin offering health insurance coverage to more Oregonians who are:

- Low-income elderly or disabled people
- Pregnant women who cannot afford health insurance
- People on General Assistance or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families
- Children in low-income families
- Some single adults and couples who cannot afford health care insurance

People who wish to apply for assistance must be a resident of Oregon, have proof of income, proof of pregnancy and due date signed by a medical provider (if seeking OHP assistance because you are pregnant), and, if applicable, proof of non-citizen status, proof of Native American/Alaskan Native status and student aid reports if OHP assistance is being sought for a college student.

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
